#### Item 3 Update from GS1 UK

Glen Hodgson shared the successes of GS1 UK Healthcare Conference and asked for feedback for future improvements

Glen also shared that Location Manager funding has been approved by the Department of Health and is now coterminous with existing contract.

# Item 4 What have we achieved this year?

#### i. EPCIS

Dave Weatherby shared that the group set out to develop the EPCIS healthcare vocabulary and it is now ready to test with implementation sites before the vocabulary is further developed.

We are engaging with NHS Digital on strategic vision of EPCIS to avoid too much localisation.

## ii. UK Registries

There is a meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> December @ Skipton House in line with the Scan4Saftey Delivery group meeting to understand how the registries can work better with Scan4 Safety trusts and utilise the data available. Registries that are due to be in attendance are National Joint Registry, NICOR, Vaginal Mesh & the Breast Implant registry.

#### iii. Staff Identification

Staff Identification document is ready but requires some live implementations to be included from North Tees, Derby & Salisbury. After discussion it was agreed that GS1 release a draft guidance to increase awareness and then release a case study when implementation has taken place.

#### iv. Coding

Agreement from NHS Digital that OPCS coding will go ahead and have a GTINs aligned to OPCS codes Action – Jo Goulding to speak with Lyn to ensure this is completed with Dave Weatherby
